Successful landscape restoration is made possible by a reliable supply of genetically appropriate native plant materials. Seed from other regions not only wastes resources but could introduce maladapted genes. The Southwest currently has few native seed producers able to provide land managers with a diversity of appropriate, locally-sourced seed. The Southwest Seed Partnership (SWSP) is working to address this challenge through a coordinated approach, connecting land managers and other seed buyers with native seed producers.

The SWSP seeks restoration seed buyers who want access to locally-sourced, genetically diverse native seed. Help us identify the species that are in greatest demand.

- Delivers native seed workshops and trainings.
- Works to ensure high quality seed by coordinating with resource experts and seed certification in NM and AZ.
- Collects ecologically appropriate seed from native species and works with farmers to produce native seed crops.
